

FIRE SAFETY OFFICER

This combined course covers a broad range of facilities and emergencies and is suitable for people working in Senior emergency response roles, including members of the Emergency Management Team. This course has been created to meet the requirements of Fire Safety Officer under NSW Health Policy and Directives.

Successfully completing this nationally recognised training will result in a Statement of Attainment being awarded for Fire Safety Officer (NSW).

The Fire Safety Officer course incorporates the following units of competency:

- PUAFER001 – Identify, prevent and report potential facility emergency situations
- PUAFER002 – Ensure facility emergency prevention procedures, systems and processes are implemented
- PUAFER004 – Respond to facility emergencies
- PUAFER005 – Operate as part of an Emergency Control Organisation (ECO)
- PUAFER006 – Lead an Emergency Control Organisation (ECO)
- PUAFER008 – Confine small emergencies in a facility

Course Subjects:

- Roles & responsibilities of the fire safety adviser
- NSW legislative & regulatory requirements for Health Care facilities
- Identify fire safety systems and equipment in your facility
- Develop an awareness & understanding of maintenance & records pertaining to fire safety
- Understand the emergency planning process
- Understanding the role & responsibilities of Emergency Control Organisation (ECO) members and the Emergency Planning Committee (EPC)
- Emergency response scenarios
- Practical fire extinguisher training

ASSESSMENT REQUIREMENTS:

Individuals undertaking this course will be expected to complete both written and practical assessment tasks.

The Training Package for this unit requires a student to be physically able to undertake risk management and use and re-stow initial response equipment
